SANA GLOSSARY of Terms

AGE

The age of a horse or pony is calculated for SANA by its birth year, not the month or day. Example: a horse born on May 1st becomes another year "older" on Jan 1st.

BREED SCORE

There are two different types of breed scores. One is very detailed for a breed specific class. The other is less detailed for an open discipline class that *may* require a breed score in addition to the discipline score. Breed scores are only given by breed specific judges.

HAND GALLOP

Four beat gait, noticeable difference in speed from the canter and a definite lengthening of the stride.

KNOCKDOWN

In over fence classes, an obstacle is considered *knocked down* when a horse or rider lowers any part of an obstacle.

NORTH AMERICAN BRED

Entry must have been conceived AND born in Canada, Mexico, or America.

PUREBRED BREED CLASSES

Open to any purebred registered or eligible for registration with any association that tracks purebreds by breed (domestic or foreign) from the Equus Survival Trust Equine Conservation list.

SPORT-HORSE & SPORT-PONY (aka PART-BREDS)

SANA favors the purebred, however we recognize the Sport-horse and Sport-pony part-breds have a flourishing industry and therefore SANA is designed to support the portions of the part-bred industry that we feel help the conservation of purebreds.

- 1) Entries must be sired by registered purebred stallions out of *non-pure* mares with one exception: Half-Lippitts must be sired by a FULL Lippitt stallion and registered purebred non-Full Morgan mare. *This promotes the use of the pure stallions and (2) it discourages the use of pure mares for sport crosses, who for conservation reasons should be producing purebreds with purebred mares.*
- 2) Open to any part-bred colt (under 3 yrs), gelding, or mare sired by a stallion from the breeds listed in the Equus Survival Trust's Equine Conservation list, and registered with an association that recognizes a part-bred ancestry for that breed.

YOUNGSTOCK / JUNIOR

Any horse or pony that has not reached the age of 3 years.
